(For Churches or Businesses)

Necessary Investments

Church – General

- Prayer support for men and this ministry to them
- Support from the pulpit
- Pastoral involvement
- Ongoing promotion (Bulletin inserts & notices, Newsletter, etc)
- Provide meeting space
- Provide access to technology (DVD player, Projection equipment, sound, etc.)
- Purchase DVD curriculum (\$300)
- Coffee and supplies

Church – Leadership Team (Goal: 3-4 men at each location)

- Ongoing prayer support
- Commitment – Summertime training plus 24 weekly meetings (see schedules)
- Investment of time and energy for preparation and execution
- Leadership
- Transparency
- Interaction with Noble Warriors for record-keeping etc.

Roles (Multi-Goose strategy) This may seem a bit goofy for men's ministry but the idea is to have several guys involved in the work of planning for and executing your Men's Ministry Program. No man should have to shoulder the load alone. The work should be spread among a team of men who have differing skills. Each guy/skill set will 'fly point' at various times during the meetings.

- Logistical Goose – arrive early, unlock doors, lights, heat, coffee, room set
- Technology Goose – setup and maintain A/V support, audio and video clips, projectors etc.
- Host Goose – monitor group health, manage small groups, welcome and greet men, communicate attendance etc with NW
- Extra Geese – Fill in as needed when others must be away.

Participants

- Register for Men's Fraternity (via e-mail, website, regular mail or at meeting location)
- Pay \$25 fee to cover book and graduation gift and help with NW administration
- Commitment – Personal commitment to participate in Winning At Work and Home (No big church push)
- Participation – Process material from each session with other men
- Complete and present personalized **Ten Key Moves** assignment – This is the only outside requirement. (Required for graduation)

Noble Warriors

- Leadership support and training (summertime program)
- Coordinate local overall publicity and marketing (newspaper, church literature, radio, website, etc.)
- Weekly wrap-up e-mails to all groups
- Plan and execute kick-off event
- Assist with graduation
- Develop and publicize overall schedule
- Publicize meeting times and locations which may lead to cross-pollination of groups
- Provide resource ideas and support (video clips, music, articles, books, etc.)
- Encourage celebration and recognition of Men's Fraternity groups and achievements
